- 8. Logo's of sanctioning bodies other than SCCA will be allowed on race cars.

RESULTS

SAFETY, TECH & IMPOUND

- 1. Driver should have their once-a-year tech inspections completed prior to their arrival at the track. Only car logbooks with One-Time-A-Year tech stamps for 2003 will be accepted. Technical inspection will be established to inspect car logbooks, helmets, safety clothing, gear and Certificates of Approval. Single event tech inspections will be granted. However, we encourage drivers to make every attempt to get Annual Tech done BEFORE arriving at the track.
- 2. Any car involved in an accident or that overturns will not be permitted on the track again until it has been inspected and passed by the Scrutineers.
- 3. Impounded cars must be accompanied to Impound by the driver or driver-designate, and one crew member only. One of them must stay with the car at all times.
- 4. Scales will be available at the track during the hours that Tech is open and in operation. Competitors may weigh their cars.
- 5. Identification numbers shall conform to GCR specifications and shall meet with the approval of the Chiefs of Timing and Scoring. Failure to comply may mean that the car will not be officially timed or scored.
- 6. Maximum sound control level for 2003 will be 103dB unless modified by Fast Track.
- 7. All drivers should be prepared to report to Impound at the conclusion of any on track session or race.

DRIVERS & CREW

- 1. Any driver who hits a solid object, rolls or flips the car, or in the opinion of safety personnel could have sustained injuries, must report to Medical within 30 minutes of the end of the session. That driver will not be permitted to compete until examined by medical personnel and approved for competition.
- 2. The track is open to vehicular traffic only during the hours of competition, and then only as stipulated by the schedule. During all other hours the track is considered closed to vehicular traffic except as necessary for worker/official use.
- 3. Yellow lights are positioned on the bridge past station 9 (over the tunnel). When displayed, these lights shall have the same meaning as the yellow flag per GCR.
- 4. The protestee and protestor shall remain available at the track pending the resolution of any protest, or until released by the Chairman of the Stewards of the Meet (SOM)
- 5. Qualifying sessions may be ended with a checkered flag at the Start/Finish line, and or a black flag and ALL sign displayed at the Black Flag Station. (Station 9)
- 6. Races shall officially start and finish at the Start/Finish line in front of the Starters stand. Lap times are recorded at Timing & Scoring in the tower and are timed at a line across from Station 14.
- 7. Any car not in position on the false grid prior to the one minute warning losses its qualifying position and must start at the rear of the field for the race.
- 8. The grid **MUST** be cleared by **ALL** personnel at the one minute warning.
- 9. For the first lap of the first session for each group each day, a white flag will be displayed at each corner station.

PITS & PADDOCK

SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS HEARTLAND PARK TOPEKA - TOPEKA, KS. SCCA HIGH PERFORMANCE CAR CONTROL CLINIC OCT. 18TH & 19TH 2003

PURPOSE

1. This event is designed to be NON-COMPETITIVE opportunities for participants to learn first hand from experienced instructors and to practice repeatedly at safe non-racing speeds, the basic principals and skills upon which the sport of motor racing is based.

PARTICIPANT REQUIREMENTS

- 1. All participants must be 18 years of age and possess a current valid driver's license issued by his or here state of residence. If a driver age 16 or 17 is a current SCCA licensed competition holder, he or she is eligible to drive. 16 and 17 year old participants (non SCCA license holders) can ride only with an SCCA driving instructor.
- 2. All participants, including drivers, workers, crew members and guests must sign the SCCA Release and Waiver of Liability, Assumption of Risk and Indemnity Agreement form # 9716.
- 3. All participants (as above), if under the age of majority in the state in which the event is being conducted, or if under the age of 21 residing in Nebraska, Alabama or Wyoming must present the registrar a fully completed Minor release and Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement form at each event.
- 4. Any driver found to have driven on course in any vehicle before having properly completed the waiver signing process will be disqualified from the event with no refund of entry fee and will be removed from the premises.

VEHICLES

ALL VEHICLES MUST PASS A SAFETY INSPECTION ON THE FOLLOWING ITEMS PRIOR TO BEING ALLOWED ON THE TRACK. ENTRY FEES WILL BE REFUNDED ID A CAR FAILS TO PASS THIS SAFETY INSPECTION.

- 1. Vehicles must be eligible for street licensure; however, the pollution control equipment need not be operable.

 - **F**. Targa type or T-top vehicles must either bolt the removable panels in place or remove them entirely.
 - **G**. All cars must run with both front door windows fully lowered.
 - H. Open cars (convertibles) must run with the top lowered and safely stowed.
 - **I**. All loose items inside and outside of the car must be removed. Passenger seat back and cushion must be secured.
- 3. Any car that is judged to be in an unsafe operating condition at any time during the event shall be prohibited from further participation until the deficiency is corrected.

DRIVER SAFETY EQUIPMENT

- 1. While on course, all participants shall wear a safety helmet meeting or exceeding Snell-SA90 or Snell M-90 or later specifications.
- 2. All drivers in open, Targa type, or T-top cars running with the roof panels removed must wear suitable eye protection, i.e. goggles, bubble shield, or face shield on full face helmets.
- 3. Suitable clothing, i.e. long pants, socks, shoes covering the entire foot must be worn while on course.

EVENT CONDUCT

ALL EVENTS SHALL BE CONDUCTED WITH A MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT OF 85 MPH

- 1. Groupings will be made based on previous experience, i.e. Solo 1, road racing, professional driving school or on track performance in an evaluation session.
- 2. An instructor shall be assigned to each student on a one to four ratio.
- 3. An instructor shall ride with each student until the Chief Instructor authorizes the student to drive alone.

EVENT CONDUCT CONTINUED

- 4. All first time participants must run in the evaluation session to determine their ability for session groupings. The assigned instructor in consultation with the Chief Instructor will make this evaluation.
- Passing will only be allowed in those sessions designated as passing sessions by the Chief Instructor. Passing will only be allowed in designated passing zones. All passes can only be made after the over taken car has acknowledged the presence of the overtaking car and signaled which side the pass is to be made on by either a hand signal or the use of the turn signals or both.
