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
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ARE YOUR NUMBERS IMPORTANT ENOUGH? Gini Ragan Chief T&S

I am just back from another race weekend where seeing a competitors number became a challenge on some cars. Some drivers were requested to change the color of their numbers and they complied, happily I hope. Other drivers didn't hear the workers in timing complain about their number but it struck me that although sponsors are important, maybe identifying the car was more so and shouldn't the number on the car be the most important? (Even a corner station called in a bad number at MAM.)

Phyllis Nelson found the following in a Grassroots Motorsports article called Turn One

"One of my college English teachers had a simple rule: Turn in a paper with a comma splice and you'd get an F. It was a harsh rule, it did make a point. (Just kidding about that comma splice there, folks.)

"I have a similar rule that involves numbers formed out of masking tape, With all of the options available today, there's no reason your car should regularly show up at motorsports events with numbers and class designations that resemble a kindergarten art project.

"Not only do tape numbers make our sport look amateurish, they can be a pain in the butt for those in the timing trailer. At my last two autocrosses, problems regarding the scoring for the event could be directly attributed to hard-to-read numbers formed from masking tape.

Don't have skills to do your own numbers? Call your local sign shop or one of the fine advertisers in this fine magazine. They can quickly whip up some good-looking numbers. Personally, I like blocky fonts, but go with what works for you. Don't forget to make them big."

The GCR states the minimum size a number can be and after that you are on your own, except if Timing and Scoring has a problem with your number, they may choose to not score your car. I have never seen that happen but it could and maybe should if you are constantly asked to make corrections.

I would also ask drivers to make sure your transponders are charged if they are battery powered and properly placed in your car (I think they came with directions on how and where to install.) Be sure you turn them on before entering the course

My last bit of advice, today, is play safe and have fun whether you are on a road course or at an autocross or participating in a rally. Irwin on Right Track

That wasn't your grandfather's race track Raymond Irwin showed off to a guest last week. It wasn't even the race track Irwin bought three years ago this weekend.

People who haven't visited Heartland Park Topeka recently wouldn't recognize the place.

I know I didn't. My mind flashed back 17 years when the O'Shaughnessy family opened the gates on the brand-new facility south of the city.

The event was the Camel Grand Prix of the Heartland, a sexy name for minor league road racing. If Indy and Formula One cars were the major leagues of road racing, the GTP cars driven at Heartland Park by the likes of Geoff Brabham and Arie Lyenkyke were high Triple-A.

We had never seen racing like that - and, based on the meager crowds who came to the races here, many of us still haven't -but it was a tantalizing appetizer to what Heartland Park Topeka could offer.

Fans watched that first Grand Prix sitting on big mounds of dirt. Members of the media watched from the rather stark, cramped confines of a mobile home.

Despite the spartan conditions, I remember thinking the Heartland Park Topeka of 1989 was pretty cool.

Now, as I ride around the expansive facility inside Irwin's minivan, I have to stifle a chuckle as I see first-hand how much the place has changed since those early days of berms and portable press boxes.

Sure, the track's cash cow - the quarter-mile drag strip, which for awhile at least carried the well-deserved distinction of the fastest drag strip in the world - remains very much the heart, literally and figuratively, of the facility, but today there is so much more.

Irwin drives us past a stunning array of new buildings. There's a new credential building, the first stop for all competitors; a new maintenance building twice as big as the current facility; 33 new garages, each with air compressor and work bench; a pavilion just east of the drag strip that will serve as a social center for racers, fans and workers alike; an 18,500-square foot tech building that includes showers and a satellite concession/souvenir stand; a 10,000-square foot building for on-site tire services; and an ever-expanding two-story timing and scoring tower and media center for road coarse events.

And that doesn't include a 23-acre patch of asphalt that will be used for the Sports Car club of America Solo National Championships coming in September.

The stunning layout, which will go on display during a ribbon cutting on April 24, shows what happens when a man has a dream.

Well, that and \$15 million.

I don't know what is more amazing, that Irwin could revive in three years a track on the verge of insolvency or that he could convince city and state leaders to pony up that kind of money, \$5 million of it coming from the city, the other \$10.46 million from state-approved STAR bonds.

He had a pretty convincing sales pitch, of course. Perhaps you've heard it: Build it, and they will come.

"Meet in the Middle Rally"

Twenty five rally teams from four MiDiv SCCA Regions came together to run the Meet in the Middle TSD road rally on Saturday, March 11. The unique aspect of this rally was that competitors had their choice of two different starting locations. Seventeen cars started at Gregg Tire in Topeka, Kansas while eight crews started from Dillon's in North Wichita. Each set of competitors followed a different route through the Flint Hills of Kansas until the rally routes merged at the second checkpoint near Cottonwood Falls, Kansas. From there the teams followed a common route to the finish at the renowned Chicken House Restaurant in the small town of Olpe, Kansas, just south of Emporia.

The second half of the rally led the teams past the historic Chase County Courthouse, the oldest, actively used courthouse in the state, to the middle of nowhere down Middle Creek road. The route also passed near the site near Bazaar, Kansas where, 75 years ago, Notre Dame football coach Knute Rockne died in a plane crash.

One goal of this rally was to energize the MiDiv rally program by offering an event that would attract more than the average 10 car field that is typically seen at a MiDiv event. This was the first event of 2006 where competitors can earn points in the year long MiDiv Regional Rally Series.

SCCA events like this rally can not occur without a significant volunteer effort on the part of many people. A very big "Thank You" goes out to these workers:

This event was an ambitious undertaking for the organizers, with a total mileage of 280 miles including both starting locations.

The results of the rally were somewhat surprising. No surprise was that first place overall went to SCCA National Rally Manager Pego Mack and her navigator Steve Nelson. Second through fourth places, however, went to Novice class entries! Second and third places went to Kansas City Region members Sandra and Al Hermans and Tim and Susan Oberle, respectively. Randy Gregg and Lonnie Worthington, from the Kansas

Region, came in fourth. Fifth place overall went to MiDiv Rally Steward and MiDiv Series organizer Bruce Bettinger and his wife Charlene.

Other Kansas City Region entries were Ken and Chelsea Snyder, competing in their first rally together, who finished 8th in class and Zach Ingalls and John Ready who finished 10th.
