They have worked hard, selecting people they felt would represent the membership and make informed decisions. The committee members and candidates for office all deserve our thanks.

The business of the KVRG Board is often conducted by conference call, so there are very few meetings that have to be attended away from home. Becoming a candidate to represent the KCR on the Kaw Valley Race Group Board is pretty easy. You need to send a resume to the Secretary, Gini Ragan, either by email to timerragan@sbcglobal.net or to 212 Warner, Bonner Springs KS 66012. The resume should, of course list any experience you think will be of benefit to the whole Board and the reason, if any, you would like to be on that Board. The KCR Board will select 3 representatives to the KVRG at the November Board Meeting. Your resume should be to the Secretary by November 25 so your Name can be placed on the ballot.

Some of the Awards presented at the Awards Banquet are earned by a point system, like the Rookie of the Year, Most Improved Driver, Regional Driver, etc. The Outstanding Member, the Newcomer of the Year and the Event of the Year are all awards that should be nominated by the members for the Board to consider. The following awards are also member nominated awards (the Board cannot know all.) The Edgar Alsbury Award for mechanical contribution to club racing, the Vic Sadler Award presented to a race worker for their contribution to Club Racing, the Crew Person of the Year for outstanding service on a club racing crew and the Spouse of the Year (selected by former winners but nominees welcomed).

So when you are casting your ballots, please take a minute to look over the form that comes with the ballot, and help the Board by letting them know about a contribution made by one of our members that should be recognized by the club.




