

RE VIEW WITH DALE SMITH Survival 101 for Volunteers

Hi Everyone,

This month, I'm going to talk about our volunteers and their roles in our Region. As most of you realize, virtually everything that happens in our Region is the result of action on the part of volunteers. In fact, we would cease to exist without their efforts. There are no paid employees. From the Region Officers, Committee Members, Specialty Chiefs, Board Members, Event Chairs, Race Workers, Registrars, Timers, Cone Chasers and Cleanup People all do their jobs without financial compensation. This always makes me wonder why we do what we do as volunteers.

The best explanation that I can offer is a combination of factors. The "love of our sport", feelings of accomplishment, appreciation from our fellow members, personal pride and many other intangible items are included in the formula. The ultimate answer is that we do this because we enjoy it. The fun we have doing this work is worth the cost and effort it takes to do it. More importantly, we stop doing it when there isn't enough fun anymore.

As I see it, we really have only two types of volunteer positions. Supervisory positions, which focus on managing our human resources, and Task oriented positions, which focus on getting specific things done. Both are essential to our success and neither is more important than the other. In fact, neither can exist without the other. Neither can be successful if the other is unsuccessful. They are true partners and must succeed together or they will fail together. While we all share the common goal of success, each type of position has its own specific set of goals and responsibilities. It is a lot like an orchestra. Each musician must master their own instrument and know their part in the music being played. The conductor, arraigner, stage manager, sound engineer and others must coordinate those individual efforts into one complex sound and performance.

I don't claim to be an expert in people management or in most of the task oriented positions that we have. There are libraries full of books from those management gurus and we have members within our own club who are the experts in our specific tasks. What I can offer are a few suggestions from my experience in both types of positions.

If you find yourself in a Supervisory (people) position:

- Know what your area of responsibility is. Who do you report to and what are the expected results? Stay within those boundaries.
- Know who you are responsible for. Don't supervise people that aren't your responsibility.
- Choose the assignments you make wisely, Grasshopper. Put people in a position that they are likely to succeed at. You will only look good if they look good!
- Give clear instruction about your assignments and expected results. Focus on "what" and "why", not on "how". You have already chosen wisely and your volunteer is an expert with a plan.
- Make sure your volunteers have the 3 things they need to achieve greatness. Information, Tools or Materials
 and Time to do their assignment. Then sit back and watch them make you look good! They will call you if they
 need you.
- Always accept their results. If the results do not meet your expectations, you probably didn't give them what
 they needed, or you didn't choose as wisely as you should have.
- Never take back an assignment unless it is given back by the assignee. Your job is to help them succeed at it, not do it for them.

If you find yourself in a Task Oriented position:

- Know who is giving you direction and how to contact them. Communication is the key deal here. Stay focused
 on this person's instructions.
- Know what is expected of you and what you have to work with. Clear communication, again!
- Ask for help if you need it! There's that C word again. No one wants you to be unsuccessful at your tasks.
- If you find yourself in a position that you don't enjoy, speak up! There's probably someone who would like to do what you're doing and something available that you would enjoy.
- Don't be afraid of failure. There are plenty of people that are here to help you succeed. The only sin is accepting an assignment and not doing it. If you find yourself unable to do an assignment, give it back.

Don't forget the most important, common theme. Whatever your role may be, you must enjoy doing it! I'll see you at our next gathering.

Everyone is encouraged to tell their driving enthusiast friends who might not get this important change to the closing time of registration. We (the SAC) want KCR autocross events to be as accessible as they can practically be, within the bounds of operating a well organized and efficient event.

(What if all the drivers gave faulty info, you'd never get results!) If you use an incorrect member #, you may never get credit for participating as that is the way points are tracked. I'm sure the Solo people have similar problems so my advice is:

REGISTER EARLY, AND KNOW YOUR NUMBERS
