RYAN BUETZER RACES AT LIME ROCK

Lime Rock, Connecticut — Race #4 of the VW Jetta TDI Cup was held in the rolling tree covered hills of Connecticut at Lime Rock Park.

The race season has really picked up as our last race was only 3 weeks ago in Portland. We hit the track on the traditional Lime Rock Friday/ Saturday race weekend. As you might know, Lime Rock has a long standing city ordinance not allowing any racing on Sunday. (A church & cemetery is with in ear-shot of the track.)

Friday - Track walk

A very short course at only 1.5 miles long, we would be running the "old" configuration, not the two chicane configuration recently run by ALMS. The track is completely flat with the exception of two significant areas, the "Uphill" & "Diving Turn." The Esses (Turns 2 & 3) looked like they would take some patients. If you turned early into 2, it screwed up your acceleration point that lead into turn 3 and then down the back stretch. The "Uphill" had extra pavement laid after a track resurface this year, so you could use all the track up to and even over the white line and not worry about dropping a tire. Now all you had to worry about was hitting the outside wall because you got greedy. The down hill "Diving Turn" was significantly steeper then it had looked on TV and pictures. The track was simple, yet fairly technical in a few spots. Friday—Practice

Along with 10 other drivers, new brake pads were installed on my car. I had to seat my pads in the first few laps and then come into the pits for a couple minutes to ensure they cooled off. When I left, I had about 20 minutes remaining. It took most of the session trying to build the confidence to roll a lot of speed out to the white line into the "Uphill." The car got light enough at the top to allow my wheels to spin. Coming out of "West Bend" into "Diving Turn" was a thrill too. A slight lift in 5th gear before reaching the bottom and turning in was all it took to make the corner. After we finished, about 10 drivers had blisters and chunks of rubber down to the cords missing on their front left tire. I had noticed some understeer in several spots, but they must of have been driving much more aggressively. It was a mix of front, midpack, and back drivers that destroyed tires. There's only one left hand turn, so the left front tire gets some serious wear with the other 5 corners going right. I

finished with a 1:01.3 which put me in 19th.

Friday - Qualifying

VW decided they would make a suspension change and let our lead instructor go out for the first 10 minutes and see if they could reduce the tire issue. Chucks of rubber missing was a great deal of concern to, VW, SCCA and BF Goodrich. We were told we would go out for 10 minutes; red flag the session to let the tires cool down, and go back out. After taking some time to get the tires warmed up, I had 2 mediocre laps with noticeable bobbles before we were brought in to check tires. We then sat...sat some more... and finally told we weren't going back out. Needless to say, many drivers were upset we only had 10 minutes of qualifying. The tire concern was only affecting 1/3 of the drivers, and I've always understood part of racing should be adapting/changing your driving style to the situation. Several drivers voiced this opinion during the post qualifying driver's meeting. They essentially penalized drivers who didn't plow into corners and blister tires in 10 minutes. I had a 1:01.2 to qualify 23rd, certainly not where I wanted to be starting.

Saturday - Race

VW made a camber and sway bar change to the cars. We were granted a 10 minute hot lap session to get accustom to the new setup. The rear was certainly looser, almost twitchy, but the car would still push if you overdrove. I had the chance to install my ChaseCam

(<u>www.chasecam.com</u>) camera (SCCA had not allowed drivers to install cameras up to this point) and excited I'll be able to watch some onboard coverage.

I had a decent start protecting my inside line, but had to go three wide into Turn 1. Turn 2, the only left hander, is only 100 yards after exiting 1. I lost two spots going into Turn 2 because I couldn't get down to the apex and lost two more at Turn 3. Not how you want to start. We ran about 12 laps and I had passed several people to move up to 22^{nd} before we had a full course caution. I grabbed one spot after getting a good jump on the restart and out breaking the guy into Turn 1. Another full course caution involving two cars moved me up to 19^{th} . Based on the time board I knew we only had about 2 laps left when the green came out again. I had two guys get a good jump on me and come inside going into Turn 1. (It should be noted that since our last race in Portland, SCCA has banned us from protecting our position. In racing, you can make 1 move off the racing line and it's not considered "blocking." SCCA & VW have forbid us from even 1 move. You MUST stay on the racing line. You will be penalized for moving off the racing line.) I knew the inside car would never make it to the apex with out slamming into the other guy and then pushing him into me. I completely backed off and sure enough, he slammed into the outside car, but I was smart enough to back off and miss having him run into me. At that point, I literally idn't care anymore. These guys were fighting for 19^{th} place! 19^{th} !!! I guarantee I hate losing as much as anybody at that track, but at some point you have to have common sense and realize it's not always worth it. I would rather finish 21^{st} , then get taken out of the race with two laps left. I estimate they each had a couple thousand dollars worth of damage, and yes, you have to pay after every race.

The Jetta TDI Cup is supposed to be about clean, developmental racing. Being patient, setting a guy up, making a good pass; not dive bombing, missing your brake point, slaming into someone, and driving off. I'm growing more and more frustrated having to worry about somebody throwing their car at me while trying to make a miraculous pass that usually leads to contact. I understand contact in a sedan series will happen, but when over 60% have damage, (or Race #1 at VIR when 26 out of 30 had damage – 86%) its too excessive.

I finished 21st, no contact and was surprisingly happy. I got a lot of race experience, some good/some bad, and feel more confident in my ability, although certainly not in some of my competitor's ability. I want to thank Pat Salerno, co-owner of Evolution Performance Driving School (www.evoschool.com), who came out to watch. It's always nice having extra support. Our next race season really heats up in September as we have 4 races in back, to back, to back weekends. Iowa Speedway Aug. 20th, double race weekend at New Jersey Motorsports Park Sept. 27-28, and Road Atlanta Oct. 3-4.

MORE RECIPES FROM THE PICNIC

The two following recipes are from Neava Ford. Neava said the potato salad originally came from Chuck Woloscsuk but that she changed it a little. Neava also said to please note on both of these recipes that she truly guesses at the amounts.

Potato Salad

3 or 4 lbs of red or Yukon gold potatoes cut in to1/2" cubes and cooked until fork tender or however you like them). Let them cool a bit before adding the rest of the ingredients.

1 red onion—cut in 1/2 " pieces

1 red or green pepper cut up

Good white vinegar, about 1/4-1/2 cup

Good olive oil, about 1/4 cup

Good olive oil - about 1/4 cup

kosher salt and fresh ground pepper to taste

Put potatoes, peppers & onion in bowl, add the olive oil &

some of the vinegar. Basically use both to taste then

add the salt & pepper. Serve warm.

Asian Broccoli Salad

One or two bunches of broccoli cut into bite size piecescubes

8 oz Craisens

1—4 oz can of sliced water chestnutsl

2 cups (about) shredded carrots

1 bottle Asian salad dressing

1 ramen nootdle package—crumbled

Combine all of the above and use about 1/2 of the bottle of dressing Don't put the noodles on until ready to serve. Serve chilled.
