My first involvement with SCCA goes a ways back. I was driving a 1964 MGB on a sunny afternoon when I came to the local 4H county fair. It looked interesting so I drove in. Almost immediately I came upon a group of cars that were loosely assembled next to a field. As I drove by, someone flagged me down and asked if I would like to enter their Field Trial. I had no idea what they were talking about but soon found myself sliding around in the dirt with my, not so trusty, MGB. That was 1971. I joined the club the following spring and here we are 40 years later.

Most of my SCCA years were spent participating in Road Rallies and Autocrosses. Autocrossing (Solo) was my favorite however. The MGB quickly gave way to a Datsun 240Z which gave me some Divisional success but not so well at the National level. My next move was into a Datsun 1200 that I built up for competition in E prepared. That's when success started to arrive with 3 National championships in 1981,'82, and '83.

The next move was into the C Modified with a LeGrand Mk25 chassis. That car which had been previously road raced needed to be rebuilt after it suffered from contact with an Armco barrier in a racing incident. That car saw the first Solo race in 1984 and earned several National Solo Championship titles, 2 in C modified and 5 in B modified.

Sometime around 2004 I began to tire of the Solo scene and learned that yard work can actually be done on the weekend instead of chasing cones. Driving a garden tractor around trees however didn't quite fill the void. It was then, in the fall of 2004 with my yard neatly trimmed, that I watched the Runoffs at Mid Ohio. That was it. My love affair with Sport Racers was rekindled with the new breed of cars that looked somewhat more like a racecar than a shoe box.


In the spring of 2006 I ran my first Road Race in a Speads Dsr at Gateway International. Oh yeah, that's way better than the garden tractor, although I'm back to doing yard work during the week. Seems like a reasonable trade to me. The learning curve was pretty steep with that car which was campaigned midway thru the 2008 season. It was sold and replaced with a Stohr WF1.

With the Stohr in hand and my sons for crew we earned a podium finish at the 2008 Runoffs at Heartland Park in Dsr. For reasons that now seem to escape me, I switched to a turbo charged engine for the next 2 Runoffs only to re-affirm that there are many ways to wreck an engine.

Now that both of my sons have started families and made me a grandpa' I needed to find a new crew for

2011. As most of my friends are of the same vintage as me, I made a move to Havoc Motorsport for the 2011 season. In hind sight this would seem to have been a good move as the team was able to give me a car that went to the front in the 1st turn and never look back for a win at the Runoffs. 30 years to the month after the first Solo championship in 1981.

CHECKPOINT asked me to share how I got into Solo. There are number of influences that brought me to SCCA solo competition. One, is my Dad. No, he didn't do SCCA solo, but he was a car enthusiast and enjoyed talking tech and watching auto racing. I remember when he first took me to SCCA's Grand Prix at Lake Garnett, in Garnett, KS, a KC region event. It was a challenging 2.8 mile narrow road race course around the lake. It fanned the flames of competition in me.

As a teenager, I spent a few years racing around in a friend's V.W. in an abandoned strip mine by Clinton Lake, near Lawrence, KS. Things didn't get really heated up until I got my first car. It was a '67 Chevelle Super Sport with a 396. You're thinking...that's way too much car for an 18 year old! Well, to me, oversteer was not a bad thing and I spent most of my young adult life sideways. It was thrilling driving at the limit!

Fast forward to about 7 years ago. My brother told me about SCCA Solo. Racing in a parking lot? Nah... not interested. But, he kept urging me to just "try it," I looked at the KCR web site and others...it did seem kind of cool. I remember driving to Arrowhead Stadium, lot "L", feeling anxious about the unknown, but when I saw how big and open it was, I exclaimed "this IS cool," out loud. My very first run hooked me (No! I didn't spin out, why do you ask?) and I can count on one hand how many events I've missed since. I started, briefly, with a '97 Dodge Neon R/T, then 5 years in a '01 Honda S2000, and for 2012 season I'm driving my JAYHAWK Racing's #45 "Wicked White" Mitsubishi Evolution IX.

So, you probably think I autocross because of all the things I just said, but I found something even better about it. The people. It's the people involved in solo—from all walks of life. They too have inspired and challenged me. If you have been around, you know what I mean. If you are new, get ready to be a part of the SCCA family of friends, spouses, and kids. They are helpful, generous and unselfish. It is a wonderful group that supports each other, encourages and helps each other...to better themselves and just have fun in this exciting motor sport.

My wife, Rosalie, (my fan, cheerleader, supporter and confidant) is the only one that really knows how much of myself I put in to my racing last year. In short, here is my basic approach. Because it's my body and mind that controls the car it starts with a proper diet, exercise and self-discipline. A good car set up really helps, and thanks to Jake Diehl's tuning business, "I've got grip." To get more seat time, I've traveled to other regions---for me, once a month is not enough practice. Before the event, I try to walk the course at least three times by myself to help me memorize every element. During an event, I analyze each run, and not just what I did wrong, but what I did right. After the event, I consider what I didn't think about enough, and go over my times and others with my calculator, sometimes looking back at other events for comparison. Overall, I'm always trying to find small ways to better myself---small things can add up and every tenth counts. Amazingly, this HAS added up for me—and I have been honored to receive the Driver of The Year for the past 3 years.

Thanks for letting me tell my story. I hope it inspires you to believe in yourself, to discover your abilities and to "find some time" out there.
