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C.O.T.A. MARCH 2013

Plans to attend the B.F.G Majors event at the Circuit of the Americas began in early January 2013 when the Lone Star Region first made the announcement. What had been rumors and speculation became reality. My oldest sons were on top of all the details from the beginning which made things much easier for me.

I am a 43 year member of SCCA. I have never registered for a race event that opened and closed the same day and close within an hour and a half of its opening. There were 520 entries. Six of the seven race groups were fully subscribed. As you might have expected there were all sorts of issues with the SM and SRF race groups. Both groups eventually ended up having to go through a lottery to provide "fairness" to the whole process.

COTA is about ten miles from downtown Austin, Texas. To get to the track from our motel involved driving about half the distance on a toll road. From where we got on the toll road to the exit point there were four express toll stations. (Express means a picture of your license plate is recorded and they send you the bill.) With as many times as we went back and forth for a variety of reasons I'm not looking forward to the bill.

The "ski tower" as many called it is visible for about two miles away as you drive south on the toll road. It doesn't look like much until you see it from inside the track. It's especially interesting as the colors of red, white and blue change at night. When you enter the main gate of COTA there is building which is marked in very large letters Circuit of the Americas. There is no doubt you are about to enter a world class racing facility. The building has two floors of about 150 suites with very fancy garages on the ground level. In front of that building was where the SCCA registration was centered.

The weekend began with test day on Wednesday. You were only allowed one of the two days of testing. My first time out was anything but fun. My first off was turn three. My second off was turn seven followed by an off on turn fifteen and then twenty. My second lap was about like the first. Eight laps later I just kept missing turn three and twenty. By the end of the day I kind of had a semi foggy view of the track in my head.

Looking at a map of the track is deceiving. The elevation gain between turn twenty and turn one is about 350 feet or perhaps a bit more. The drop off between one and three is about equal to that of turn twenty to turn one. Once you enter turn three the climb begins again all the way to turn eleven where the you begin the I-o-n-g trip to twelve. The GT 1 cars were clocked at 150 to 165 mph.

The second most difficult part of the track begins with turn twelve which is a ninety degree left hander. Turns thirteen to eighteen are a series if double apexes requiring some intense concentration to get them right. If all goes well, getting through nineteen is a matter of throttle management. Entry into twenty requires hard braking and an early entry in order to maintain momentum for a good run up the hill into one.

Overall the Lone Star Region did a good job with registration and making the competitors feel welcome. With so many cars in each group, time management became a problem. As an example, the Group 7 race (ground pounders) on Saturday didn't happen. They were the first and last race of the day Sunday. And the track time we were suppose to have Sunday morning was eliminated. Hence, the fastest race lap Saturday became your grid spot Sunday. Removing disable cars was painfully slow. That task was handled by local fire fighters who did the job like they were working on the street.

At the outset of the weekend COTA management stated they would consider the SCCA weekend a learning experience. They closed the meeting with a promise to listen and implement whatever changes would benefit future SCCA race weekends. So, I'll begin saving a portion of my monthly Social Security check in hopes of going back to COTA next year. It was truly a great experience.
