These are great ways to meet new members and maybe run into old members that you have not seen in a long time and besides it is a great way to have fun time doing what we love to do.



## KCR Members Start Their SOLO Season Early in Salina by Jessica Dorn

The sun was shining, and the weather was warm. It was a perfect day for racing - not just any racing but the first SOLO event of the year! On Sunday, March 22, a handful of KCR members loaded up their trailers, packed their trunks, and headed west to Salina, KS for their opening auto cross event. The warm weather brought out 51 competitors ready to scratch their racing itch on the narrow course that challenged drivers through the slaloms, pinch cones, tight turns, and Chicago boxes.

The Salina Region was extremely welcoming and glad for the large turnout. Several "warm-weather walkups" bumped them from a 2 heat day to a 3 heat day. It was a good way to not only polish up our driving skills but to also polish up our process of getting race ready. As we all know, race day can be a little hectic. First, you must prepare for the race and pack the car – tires, tools, tire pressure gauge, tire jack, helmets, sunscreen, snacks, water, Go Pros, etc. Then, you have to drive to the event site, go through registration, and prep the car for tech. Tires need changed, harnesses strapped in, racing numbers placed on the car, cameras set up, and helmets set out before it can go to tech. After you're clear to race, there is a course walk and a driver's meeting. Finally, it's time to race!

John Herrman, and Jeremy Salenius with co-driver Doug Patterson knew the tight handling and quick response of their Mini Coopers could handle the narrow course. But the tight slaloms at the end proved to be a challenge even for the Minis. Chuck Wilson also tested his Subaru BRZ through the turns but was unable to utilize the full potential of his horsepower. Brad Smith, in his Red Devil, handled the course like a champ and came away with the FTD of 40.241.

## Solo off to a soggy start

The first three rounds of the Kansas City Region SCCA's 2015 Solo Championships are in the books. The festivities began at the Metropolitan Community College Precision Driving Center in Independence, MO with our annual Test and Tune event on Saturday, April 11th, the day before Event #1. The weather for the Test & Tune was magnificent with mild temperatures under a cloud-dotted blue sky. Many of the usual unusual suspects came out to shake loose the rust of the off-season, but we also had a number of novices come out to take part in the insanity that is our sport. In all, 54 drivers took part and prepared themselves and their machines for Sunday's competition.

Sunday's weather was dramatically different than Saturday's. The day began cool and damp as rain showers had passed through the area in the early morning hours. Under a steady and cold drizzle, the set-up crew began their work on course and grid. Once everything was set up and ready to go, the site was hit by a powerful thunderstorm bringing significant lightning and 40+ mph wind gusts. Many of the pop-up canopies that people had deployed were upside-down or inside out. Fortunately the storm was brief and the clean-up was started right away. ...cones, cones everywhere.



The rain wasn't quite finished as the Junior karters and Heat 1 drivers took to the wet course. With the facility being reasonably flat, there were many areas of the course where the drivers had to negotiate their way through standing water. It made for good photo opportunities, but for slow times. The wet track even caught some veteran drivers off guard. Although there were a couple of tense moments as some drivers headed off the asphalt an onto the wet, slick grass, the worst damage done was to pride and to the run times.



Drivers in Heat 2 saw a drying track and warmer temperatures resulting in the times getting quicker and quicker through the session. Fortunately, due to the lower turnout resulting from the forecast, the competitors were divided between the two heats by class. This meant that although the PAX times would be unfairly weighted toward the Heat 2 drivers, the class battles were unaffected.



Events #2 and #3 on April 25th and 26th made up our first of two double-header weekends at Heartland Park Topeka. Although the future of the racing facility remains in doubt, we were allowed to retain our previously negotiated weekend, and we had the place all to ourselves! It was eerie with no other activity on the road course, no roar on Saturday night from the dirt track, and sadly no food vendors open for lunch. A few arrived on Friday to set up the course and get things ready for the show on Saturday morning. Saturday brought early thunderstorms making the drive out an interesting one. The skies remained threatening all day long with intermittent rain showers throughout the morning.

As with Event #1, Heat 1 was run on a wet track with abundant pools of standing water. While there was the occasional sprinkle, there was no other significant precipitation during the heat and the track began to dry out. The decision was made to run the Junior karts between Heats 1 and 2 in hopes of allowing the youngsters the opportunity to race on a dry track. In full accordance with Murphy's Law, however, a steady rain began almost as soon as the karters did, wetting the track and the drivers. Heat 2 remained dry and the temperatures began to climb, and it showed in the run times. The times dropped precipitously throughout the session as grip levels rose.



While Sunday's Event #3 was dry the whole time, the temperatures were significantly cooler than during Event #2 on Saturday. The cooler, denser air might make for more power, but it did horrible things to the grippiness of the Heartland Park asphalt. With traction hard to find, vehicle control, balance, and throttle skills were at a premium. Challenging driving conditions bring the best drivers forward, however. Sadly, this may be our last event at Heartland Park Topeka in light of the City Council's decision to allow the motorsport venue to proceed into foreclosure. We'll have an update on the future of Heartland Park Topeka in next month's Checkpoint.

- Students learn emergency braking and skid control, how to control proper braking, and **how to avoid accidents entirely**. In select schools, in addition to spending time in the driver's seat of parked 18-wheeler to fully comprehend its massive blind spots, teenagers witness the violent detonation of an air bag, which reinforces proper hand placement on the steering wheel.
- Students are taught in their own cars, not specially prepared program vehicles, so the skills they learn can be directly translated to their daily driving experiences. Tire Rack Street Survival® challenges teenagers to understand how to control a vehicle, rather than just operate one.

**Tire Rack Street Survival**® is open to licensed and permitted drivers ages 15-21. Forms, schedules and more information can be found online at <u>www.streetsurvival.org</u>. The cost is \$75 per student and some insurance companies offer premium discounts to graduates.

The program is in its 13th year having trained 14,800 new drivers. 101 schools were completed last year and the goal for 2015 is over 125 nationally.

For the 6th year, **Michelin North America** is supporting the Street Survival program by providing funding for pavement rental for each school through the United States. That is no small task, given that this year the **Tire Rack Street Survival®** schools plan to offer its training to teens all across the U.S.
