The New Normal:

SCCA Guidelines as we Return to Racing

The National SCCA offices have been hard at work helping Region's prepare to get out and race again as stay-at-home orders are being lifted and cities are reopening. While we are all eager to get back out to the sport we enjoy and catch up with racing friends, we must be do so in socially responsible manner—keeping everyone's safety and health in mind. Please review the following documents from National SCCA:

COVID-19: Guidelines for Events

This interim guidance is provided to SCCA Regions preparing to resume event activities to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 between participants. SCCA supports taking a pro-active role to employ behaviors and protocols as defined by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) along with Federal and state guidelines that helps protect the health of those attending events. Regions may incorporate additional measures based on local mandates and recommendations.

It is strongly recommended that the following statements be added to Event Supplemental Regulations and to event registration pages.

Notice to Participants: In light of the current COVID-19 situation, every attempt will be made to minimize the risks of exposure to the virus. New processes and procedures are being developed and will be put into place for events going forward.

Off, and to make the decision on whether or not to participate. If you are feeling unwell or are experiencing symptoms such as fever, cough, or shortness of breath please stay home. IN THE DRIVER'S SEAT with MARK HILL

TIRE TEST IN THE WET! Bridgestone RE-71R vs Michelin Pilot Sport 4S



In the April 2020 Checkpoint, I talked about how important tire selection is and I shared my test results; The RE-71R's came out on top, on a dry course. Yes, it's also fast in the wet, but not the fastest.

Here's my take (based on data & experience): on the RE-71R vs 4S tires in the wet. This is not exactly an apples-to-apples test like last time though, given that the RE-71R's are 265/35/18, \$259 each, 200 wear-rated, on Enkei 10" wide RPF1 wheels and the 4S's are 245/40/18, \$198 each,

300 wear-rated, mounted on a 8" Sport Addition wheels. The narrower width 4S choice is on purpose to reduce hydroplaning, but would hurt it's dry performance. These two tires approach wet traction in very different ways and that makes a huge difference in AX times. While they both have wide circumferential grooves (RE-71R has 2 the 4S 3.5) to reduce hydroplaning, the RE-71R with 8/32 tread depth (the tire on the right) has directional diagonal, lateral grooves that are designed to evacuate water. The 4S with 9.5/32 tread depth, has an asymmetrical tread design with the outer half of the tire using a dry-focused hybrid rubber and the inside half utilizing a silica-infused wet compound.

I could tell something was up with the 4S's...I had stacked tires in two-high sets in the bed of my truck, and just grabbed and slid one of the top RE-71R off easily, as usual. But when I grabbed and pulled on the 4S, I instantly noticed the rubber kept me from sliding it off the other 4S and when I pulled harder, they made a high pitched screeeeeeeetch sound, as they resisted movement. Hmm? That's weird, I thought.

THE TEST was performed on the asphalt of HMP on a national style 55 second-ish course, 65 degrees, light to medium intermittent rain, 3 runs each. I was the driver and in the Evo. The RE71-R's spun on even mild launch and exhibited huge understeer in most corners with a grab and let-go characteristic in the sweepers. My car's rear-end wanted to let loose in the slaloms and offsets, as well as corner exits, so I was forced to stay off the power and keep my speed down. These tires kept me from any aggressive driving to lower my times. Unlike in the dry, they never warmed up a bit. The only time I could find was by adjusting my driving. Still, the tires were... O.K.

The 4S's on launch felt almost as if I was on dry pavement with an initial spin then hook-up, letting me put the power down sooner. On the first corner, I braced myself for the understeer that never occurred. After I barreled through the corner, I thought... WOW... and my confidence in them soared. I was able to get on the gas much sooner in corner exit. The 4S's stuck like glue in slaloms and offsets with just a hint of oversteer...but with a linear and telegraphed feel. It was the same in the sweepers and my times dropped as I learned I could trust the tires to be composed and dependable.

THE RESULT: the 4S's were over 2 seconds faster than the RE-71R's. The 4S's grant you with unwavering confidence in the wet when used for a "race" street tire. Plus, when it rains, temperatures are usually low(er), which is a detriment to adhesion for tires like the RE-71R but doesn't seem to bother the 4S's and I think with the 4S's dry abilities...close to tires like the RE-71R... it could be an excellent all-around tire for folks who just want to arrive-and-drive.

What about their performance in a real-world AX setting, competing against other drivers and tires? Well, just recently on May 17th, I went to the St. Louis region AX at their Family Arena site (hey, where were all you KCR guys?). Its asphalt, about as



wide as HMP and about 3 times as long (workers are just specs at the far end). It was a well-run event with 102 registered drivers, FCO [first car off] at 9:30 am on the dot, 5 runs (usually 6) on a 65 degree day with light to medium sprinkles all day with some intermittent medium/heavy rain. I ran the 4S's all day. 1st run it was sprinkling and I kept expecting the front tires to let go but they never did, so I pushed the car harder and the back-end broke loose big time and I DNF'd. 2nd run was in a down-pour, they didn't hydroplane, and the back-end did get a little loose a couple times, but

only in over-zealous power-on corner exit. Back to sprinkles on the 3rd run, I felt I could push the car pretty hard and it worked...my time dropped by two seconds...and a cone...oops. 4th run, with growing confidence in the 4S's, the car found 1.5 seconds and did it clean. By the 5th run it had stopped sprinkling, but still a wet course... the car powered thru the course with ease a half second quicker...clean. The tires made my car look good and it won everything....class, raw time and even PAX. I'm a believer! Can I get an AMEN?


