The Story Behind the Award: Edgar Alsbury Mechanic of the Year

The Mechanic of the Year award is named after creator and fabricator Edgar Alsbury.

Working out of his house in Roeland Park, Edgar could literally make anything, fix anything and create anything. He was the "go to" guy to get anything repaired or replaced along with being one of the great personalities of our regions past.

No mention of Edgar is complete without mentioning his wife Suzy. Suzy was the national points keeper for division road racing for close to 20 years.

In 1956, James Broadwell, president of the Broadwell Distributing Company, bought a 1949 Crosley for running gear, whittled a wooden model of the final shape he envisioned, then set about building a car called the Jabro. Broadwell partnered with Alsbury to put together the production Jabros, welding the frames in the basement of the Alsbury house. Edgar later went on to develop a mid-engine version of the Jabro on his own.

After this venture, Edgar went on to build the Alsbury special, an H Modified sports racer and then in about 1960 the Dubury H Modified sports racer, both originally Saab powered. The name Dubury comes from a combination of names from the driver out of St Louis, Dick Durant (a character all on his own) and Edgars last name Alsbury. The Dubury was innovative for its time and went on to great success in Midwest Division national racing.

For those that Edgar thought highly of, he presented them with a special hand-made brass hammer with a wooden handle. It was considered kind of a trophy all in itself. Edgar was also a mentor to other notable region members like Tom Holstrom.

Edgar was also known for his truisms like, "You can only see one side of the car at a time" – of course said when one side of the car didn't quite match the other side.

For his mechanical abilities and his willingness to help anyone with their cars, the Mechanic of the Year award is named after Edgar Alsbury.

Heartland Spring Majors: May 14-15, 2021
